- **RAKSHABANDHAN ASSEMBLY**

Rakshabandhan marked the onset of the festive season on **3rd August**. The special assembly was presented by students of **UKG-M**. The video began with a short introduction by the class teacher, Mrs. Diya Purkayasta with the help of a puppet show. Janmashtami was celebrated as a special assembly where a skit was enacted by the students to give a traditional touch to entire celebration.
