- On 5th October it was conducted in Little Angels School and was much appreciated by all.

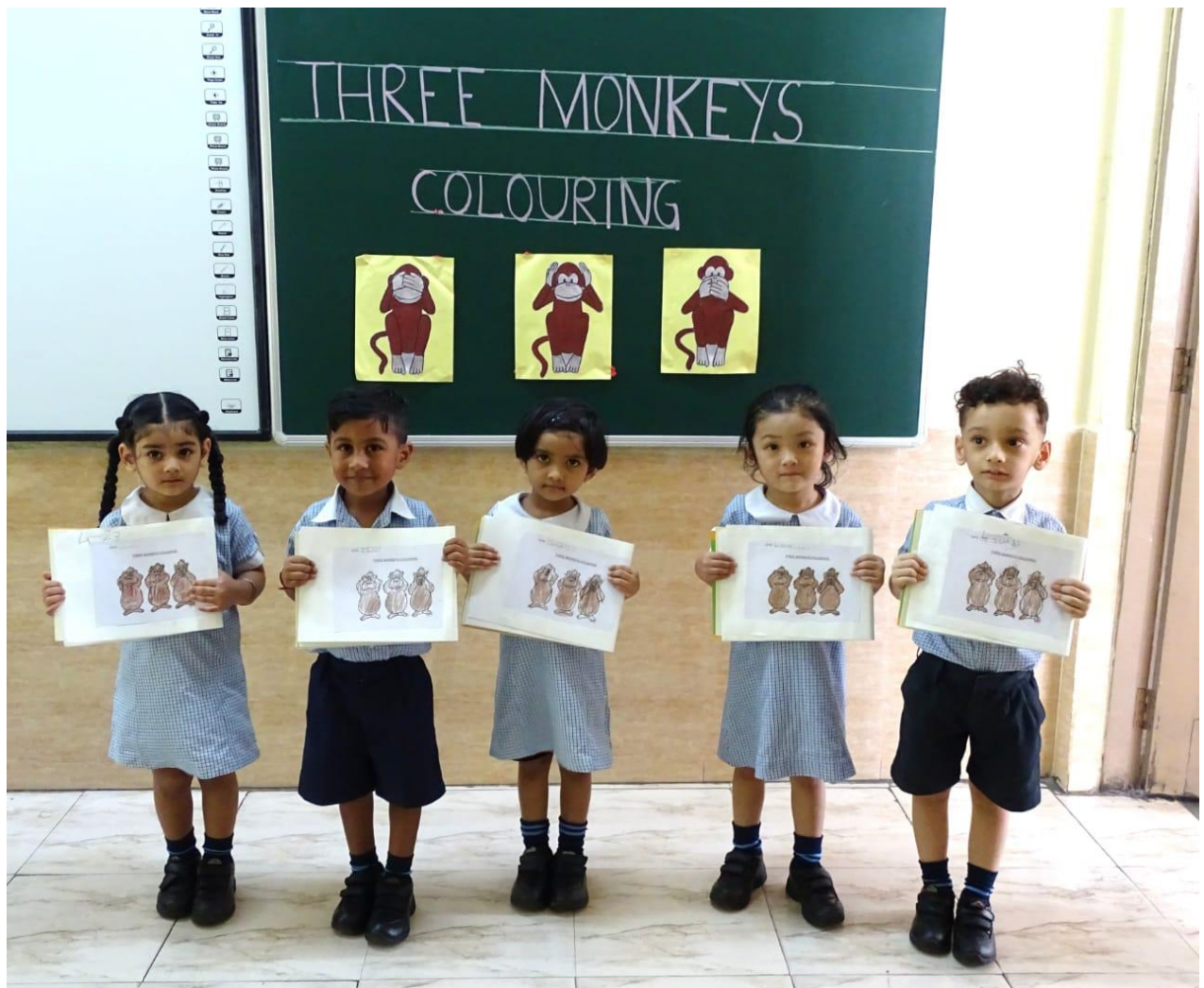

- **THREE MONKEYS COLOURING**

Gandhi Jayanti is a special day in India when we remember Mahatma Gandhi, a great leader who believed in peace and non-violence. On 3rd October, children coloured pictures of three monkeys. These monkeys represent Gandhi's famous principle: "See no evil, hear no evil, speak no evil." It means we should avoid doing bad things, listening to bad things, and saying bad things. It's a simple way to teach students about honesty and kindness, just like Gandhi taught us. So, on Gandhi Jayanti, children had fun colouring these three monkeys and learning important lessons about being good and kind.



- **PICTURE TALK**

An activity on Picture talk - 'Garden ' was conducted in the morning assembly on 9th October. Teacher created a scene of garden on the stage where kids were able to learn the topic clearly. Teacher explained how to take care of plants and trees through the topic. It developed the language skills and awareness of the surrounding of children.



- **CO CURRICULAR ACTIVITY**

As a part of Co-Curricular Activities, Hindi Story Telling Activity- 'Meri Kahaani Suno' was conducted on 12th October for LKG and on 13th October for UKG. Co-curricular activities help in the personality development of children and give them a platform to express themselves freely. It also improves their communication skills and builds their confidence. Both LKG and UKG students participated in this activity with great enthusiasm and thoroughly enjoyed the activity.



- **DUSSEHRA SPECIAL ASSEMBLY**

India is known as a land of festivals and celebrations. Dussehra is one of these special occasions. The Children of LKG- J held a special assembly on 18th October to teach and learn the significance of Dussehra as an occasion to mark the triumph of good over evil. The programme started with welcoming the gathering to narrate the importance of celebrating Dussehra. The students presented a short enactment of Ramayana in a beautifully through skit. The students were joyfully dressed as characters. Each character spoke their lines confidently. They enthralled their friends with a group dance to the popular song "Mere Ghar Aye Ram". This auspicious day reminds people of the fact that truth always wins and motivates them to follow the path of dharma.





- **PAPER TEARING AND PASTING ACTIVITY**

Paper tearing and pasting activity was undertaken for UKG students on 18th October. Children were given colourful sheets paper. They were asked to tear the paper and paste the paper bits within the outline picture of Raavan. The teacher also told the children about the king of Lanka and narrated the story of Ramayan in short. This activity was conducted to improve the fine motor skills of children along with their general knowledge. Children thoroughly enjoyed doing this activity.



- **DURGA MAA CROWN MAKING ACTIVITY**

Durga Maa crown making activity was conducted for LKG and UKG students on 18th October 2023. The teacher prepared paper cutouts in the shape of a crown. Students were asked to decorate the crown with bright coloured papers of various shapes. This activity allowed the students to give shape to their imagination and brought out their creative skills. It also helped in strengthening their fine motor skills. The children thoroughly enjoyed doing this activity.



- **COLLAGE OF WILD AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS**

UKG students were taught about our animal kingdom. The teacher told the students how animals are classified into wild and domestic animals and the characteristic feature of animals in each category. To make learning interesting and fun, the teacher readied a chart with the heading of wild and domestic animals on either side. Students were asked to pick up pictures of various wild and domestic animals from a tray and paste them under the correct heading. In this way, a collage of wild and domestic animals was prepared in class. This activity was conducted on 18th October and helped in enhancing the vocabulary and general awareness of students in a play way method along with improving their fine motor skills.



- **SHRAMDAAN**

Shramdaan means a voluntary contribution by the person towards community welfare by physical effort. In order to inculcate the value in the present generation, Shramdaan is organized every day at Naval Kindergarten, Dolphin Hill. As a part of Shramdaan, one child from each class is nominated every day to put the classroom dustbin in the main dustbin. It also includes cleaning of the class rooms by the students before they leave. The aim is to help children understand the dignity of labour and the sense of responsibility towards keeping the environment clean.



- **BAG LESS DAY**

As a part of a bag less day on 18th Oct, children of Naval Kindergarten, Dolphin Hills observed no books, no formal education. Their day was planned with fun activities, including learning through activities. The day started with the enacting story of Dussehra. Following this, children enjoyed Durga maa Crown activity, Ravan paper tearing and pasting activity, which will help enhance fine motor skills. Children enjoyed all the activities thoroughly.





- **EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING**

UKG students went for Nature walk in the school premises. They got an opportunity to touch and feel the models of various animals in our school animal park. Students called out the names of all animals. This activity helped in developing creative thinking among children. It improved the general awareness and fine motor skills of students. The children thoroughly enjoyed this activity.



- **INTEGRATED LEARNING**

Animal Kingdom was taught to UKG students as a part of EVS concept. The teacher explained to the students about the various classifications of animals. The habits, habitats and other features of animals were also taught to the students. For revision of the concept, the teacher readied a chart with the heading of wild and domestic animals on either side and mentioned the number of pictures to be stuck on each side. Students were asked to pick up pictures of various wild and domestic animals from a tray, according to the number mentioned in the chart, and paste them under the correct heading. In this way, a collage of wild and domestic animals was prepared in class. This activity was conducted on 18th October and helped in enhancing the numerical skills, vocabulary and general awareness of students in a play way method along with improving their fine motor skills. This activity was conducted to implement integrated learning in class.



- **PUBLIC SPEAKING**

Public Speaking on the topic "Mahatma Gandhi" and "Dress" was done on 3rd and 31st October respectively. It benefits kindergarten students by enhancing their communication skills and boosting their self-confidence. It encourages them to express themselves clearly, articulate their thoughts, and develop good pronunciation. Additionally, it helps in overcoming shyness and fear of speaking in front of others, skills that are valuable throughout their academic and personal lives.



UKG

Public speaking on the topic “My Pet Dog” was held on 10th October. The teacher explained about the Pet Dog and few things related to him like what he likes to eat, drink etc. She also taught few lines about the topic and children were encouraged to repeat after her. The aim was to improve vocabulary and develop communication skills.



- **CONVERSATION SKILLS**

Conversation skills on the topic "Caring and sharing with friends" was conducted during morning assembly. A role play was conducted to emphasize the importance of caring for others as well as the environment and sharing among friends. The aim of this activity was to nurture communication skills, develop vocabulary and good practices in daily life.



UKG
