The month of November was filled with lots of fun and frolic. The activities planned in the month, witnessed lot of enthusiasm among the children.

- **DIWALI SPECIAL ASSEMBLY**

On 10th November, Naval Kindergarten, Dolphin Hill celebrated the festival of Diwali. The students of LKG K conducted a special assembly to mark this festival. The assembly started with a conversation between two children, wanting to know why and how do we celebrate Diwali. Then the audience were narrated the story of Lord Ram and Mata Sita coming back to Ayodhya after 14years! Subsequently a small skit was also performed to depict the homecoming of Lord Ram and Mata Sita to Ayodhya. The students then danced on traditional music to add to the celebrations. They were also explained how people decorate their houses with colourful rangolis and light up diyas to celebrate the festival of lights! Then the importance of doing Laxmi-Ganesh Puja was also explained. The students were then told how one should responsibly celebrate Diwali by not bursting crackers to avoid pollution.



- **LANTERN MAKING ACTIVITY**

As part of Diwali celebrations Lantern making activity was conducted on 10th November. Children coloured the printed lantern and decorated it. It was given to them and teacher encouraged them to celebrate Diwali with lights, instead of fireworks. Children thoroughly enjoyed the activity.

- **ANNUAL SPORTS DAY**

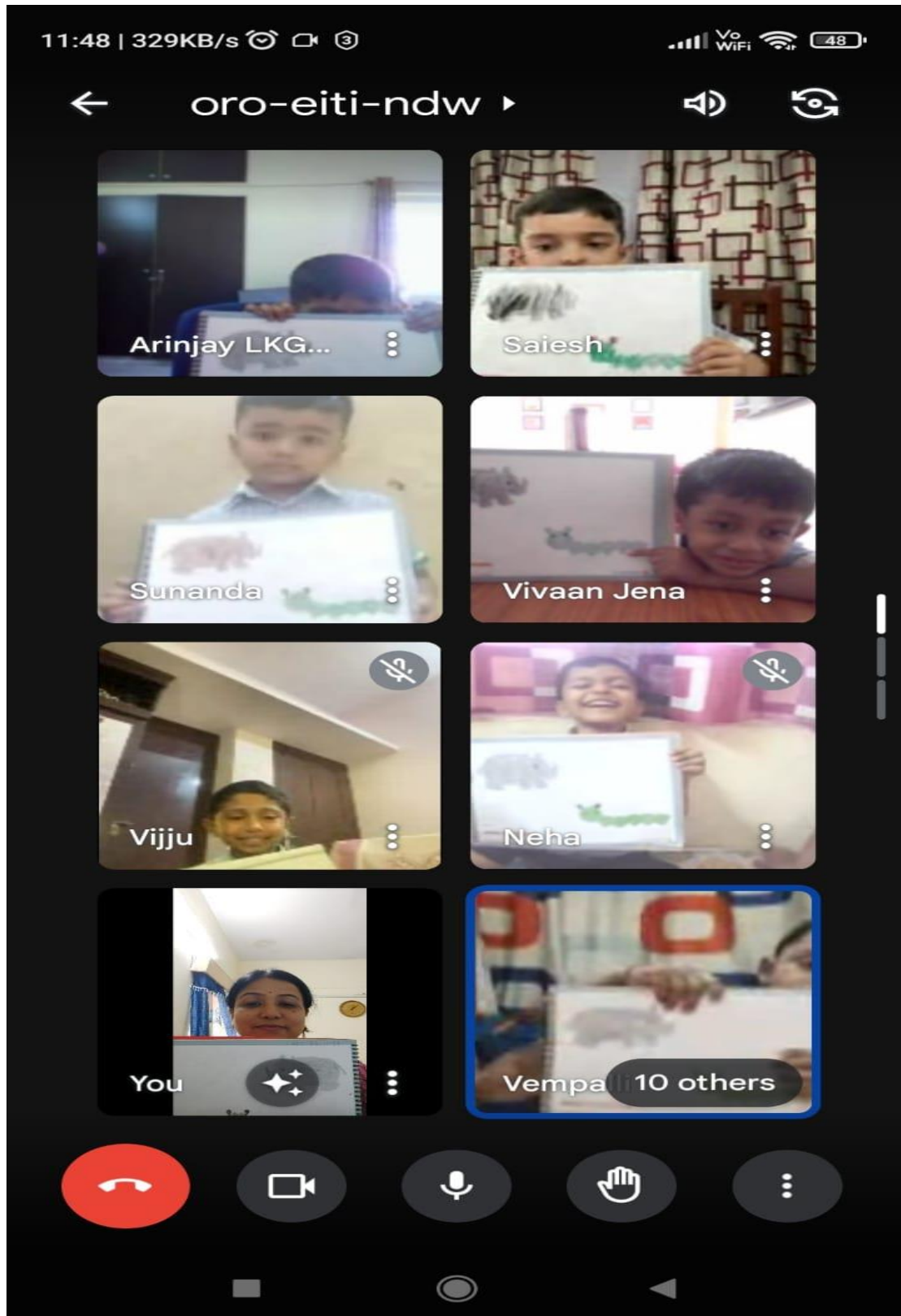

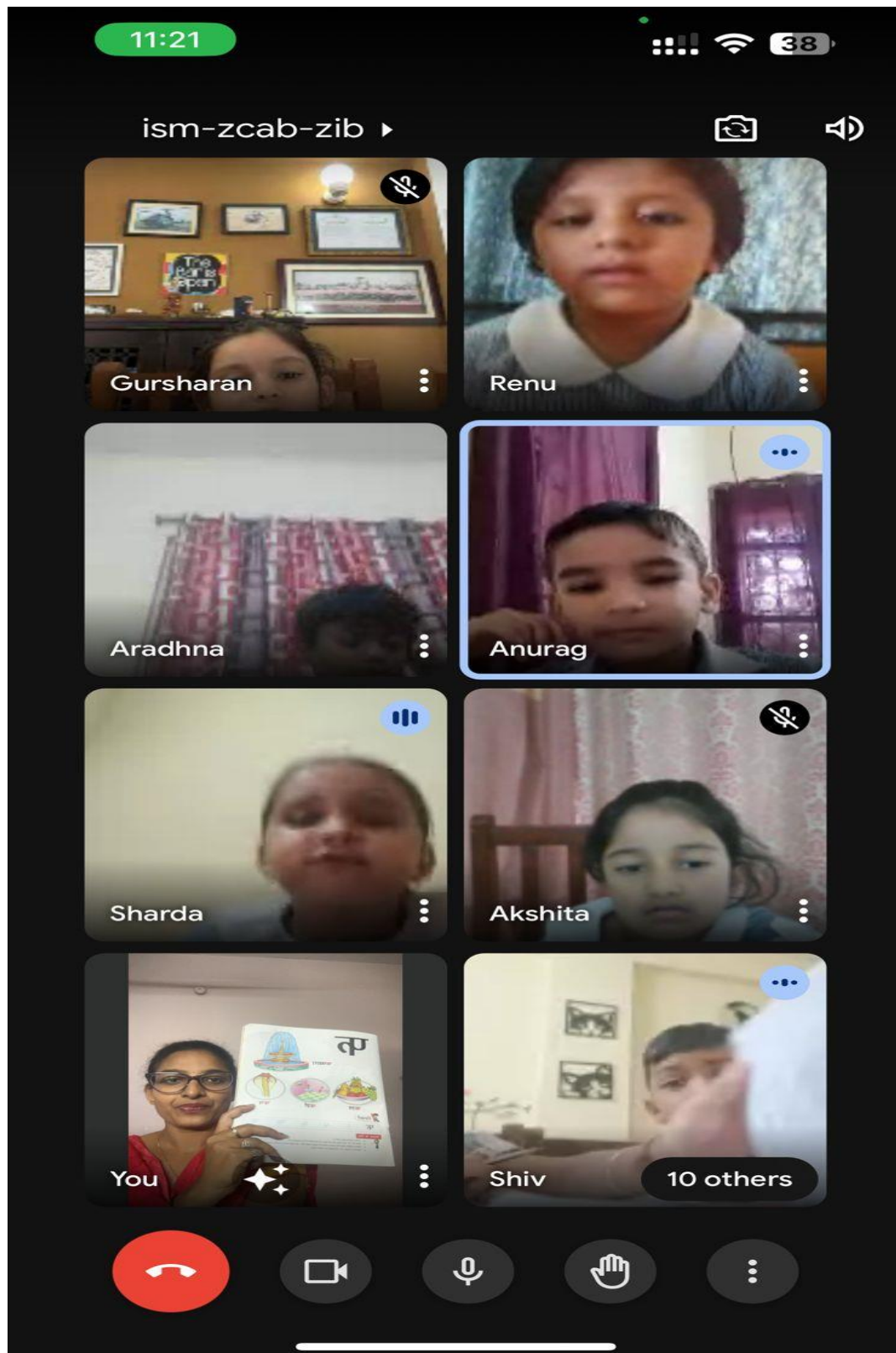
- **ANIMAL RELATED CRAFT ACTIVITY**

Animal stencil pasting activity was done on 17th November. Teacher had given clear instructions to the students and they had taken out the animal stencil, drew the animal and coloured it. It developed their fine motor skills and language skills.



- **ONLINE CLASS**

View unavailability of school buses on 17th November, online class was conducted through webinar. Topics from the daily split up including activities and rhymes were covered in the webinar. It gave children the experience of class room during online studies.



- **FREE HAND DRAWING - TRANSPORTS**

FHD Transport was conducted on 17th November through online class. This activity was conducted to reinforce the topic and helps children to relate to it. It also helped to enhance imagination and creativity in children through free hand drawing experience.



- **TRAFFIC SIGNAL TAKE AWAY**

As a part of their curriculum, children were taught about various aspects of safety including road safety. The concept of traffic signal and the significance of red, yellow and green lights were introduced to the children in the morning assembly on 21st November. The same was reiterated in class by their teachers using chalk board, smart board, textbooks, etc. The children also recited red light, red light rhyme along with their teachers. In the activity class, children were asked to stick red, yellow and green coloured paper on the black framework of paper traffic signal. This was given to the children as a takeaway to carry back home. An important concept was taught to the children in a play way method and the children thoroughly enjoyed the activity.



- **CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

As a part of Co-Curricular Activities, “English Story Telling Activity- Once Upon A Time” was conducted on 22nd November for LKG and on 23rd November for UKG. Co-curricular activities are essential for the personality development of children and make them more confident. It provides them with opportunities that teach them important life skills related to teamwork, presentation, communication skills, etc. Both LKG and UKG students narrated their stories with the help of beautifully crafted props and with appropriate voice modulation. - **PICTURE TALK**

On 24th November, Children of Naval KG, Dolphin Hills, celebrated Guru nanak jayanthi. Children of LKG-L explained why and how we celebrate guru purab. The special assembly started with Prabhat pheri, and Preaching of Guru nank ji were explained by children. The program was concluded by dance performances of children. Everyone enjoyed the assembly and learned moral values of Guru nanak ji.





- **SENSE TRAINING**

'Smell of different things ' was explained in the morning assembly on 24th November by showing different real objects. It helped the children to develop their sense - 'smell'.



- **SHRAMDAAN**

Shramdaan means a voluntary contribution by the person towards community welfare by physical effort. In order to inculcate the value in the present generation, shramdaan is organized every day at Naval Kindergarten, Dolphin Hill. As a part of shramdaan, one child from each class is nominated every day to put the classroom dustbin in the main dustbin. It also includes cleaning of the class rooms by the students before they leave. The aim is to help children understand the dignity of labour and the sense of responsibility towards keeping the environment clean.



- **CARE FOR NATURE**

Planters with plants of different varieties are hung up outside each class to bring an aesthetic sense to the school corridors. Children are encouraged to water the plants to highlight the importance of caring for the nature and maintain the surroundings beautiful.



- **FIELD TRIP TO THE AQUARIUM**

The students of Naval Kindergarten, Dolphin Hill were taken to Matshya Darshini Aquarium on 29th November. The children arrived with full of eagerness and excitement to have a fun filled day. The trip began with having lot of fun with children singing rhymes and songs during the bus ride to the venue. The children enjoyed observing and learning about the aquatic animals and all sorts of exotic fish as it creates a sense of wonder for them. After which it was time to board the bus for the return ride. The day ended with a round of juice, chocolates and snacks provided by the school.







- **FRUIT CHAAT ACTIVITY**

In November, the EVs syllabus covered healthy food, focusing on vegetables and fruits while addressing the adverse effects of junk food on health. On the 28th November, a group activity involved making fruit chat, emphasizing the importance of incorporating diverse fruits into daily diets for overall good health.



- **PUBLIC SPEAKING**

LKG

Public speaking on the topic “Going to the market” was held on 1st November. A market scenario was set up in the assembly hall. Children enthusiastically started buying and selling various fruits and vegetables, as they do in the market with their mother or father. Teacher also encouraged them to carry cloth bag and discouraged use of 'one time use plastic bags'. Thereafter, she introduced few concepts related to the topic and encouraged children to repeat after her. The aim was to improve vocabulary and develop communication skills.



Public speaking on the topic Jawaharlal Nehru was held on November 9th November. Teacher explained about Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India, his special love and care for children and the reason for celebrating his birthday as 'Children's Day'. Thereafter, children were made to share it with their classmates.



UKG

Public speaking on the topic "My favorite vehicle" was conducted on 3rd November. The teacher explained about the cycle and the uses of it. She also taught few lines about the topic and children were encouraged to repeat after her. The aim was to improve vocabulary and develop communication skills.



- **STORY**

The story of "The Fox & the Grapes" was narrated by the teacher on 9th November 2023. To make the story narration more interesting, teacher used relevant props. Teacher also did a role play in the assembly to narrate the story in an effective way. To reiterate the story a puppet show was conducted on 23rd November. Thereafter students were also asked to narrate the story in their own words. Students enjoyed listening to the story. Through this narration, teacher also tried to foster moral values in the young minds.



UKG

Story telling is an important aspect of children's life. It enhances their listening, imaginative and logic skills. It inculcates moral values in children. It plays an important role in improving child's vocabulary and pronunciation. The Truthful Woodcutter was demonstrated for UKG on 2nd November for the holistic development of the children.



- **DIYA MAKING ACTIVITY**

Through the diya painting activity we allow children to express themselves creatively and develop their own sense of identity. It also improves their fine motor skills as well as eye hand coordination.

- **CONVERSATION SKILLS**

Conversation skill on "Eating Food ' was done on 20th November. Teacher did the revision of the topic fruit and vegetables and asked different questions on food to the kids. It developed their speaking and social skills.

UKG

A conversation skill was conducted on 3rd November in Assembly on the topic 'Helping Parents at home'. Conversation skills are important for child's development and wellbeing. The aim was to help children to have good communication skills and express themselves in a better way.

- **MESSAGE OF THE MONTH**

LKG

The message of the month "Eat healthy, Stay healthy" was done on 30th November. Children were told about the benefits of having healthy food; and they were also told about the disadvantages of having junk food or unhealthy food. Free hand drawing of vegetable and fruit was done by the students. This was conducted to inculcate the practice of healthy eating habits among the children.

UKG

The message of the month "Stick to the rules" was done on 30th November. The teacher told the students about the importance of following certain rules to maintain discipline and order in society. Children drew a picture, depicting zebra crossing and traffic signal in their EVS notebooks, showing obedience towards traffic rules. This activity was undertaken to teach children that it is their duty to follow certain rules to avoid any unpleasant situation and maintain law and order and harmony in society.

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
